You are invited to join Karen Scanlon for a special presentation at Cabrillo National Monument. Three days a year the lantern of the Old Point Loma Lighthouse is open to the public. **The park opens at 9:00 AM,** and for those interested in climbing to the lantern, it's best to enter at that time and be the first to the lighthouse when **tours begin at 9:30 AM.** It's a bit of a climb up the winding stairs and then up an iron ladder into the lantern. This is the 125th anniversary of the last lighting of the old lighthouse.

At 11:00 AM we'll meet in the CNM Auditorium for a PowerPoint presentation and question/answer time with the lighthouse sisters Joan and Pat Dudley. They grew up at the Point Loma Light Station and will present, along with CNM volunteers Karen and Kim, *Growing Up at San Diego's Lighthouse*. Joan and Pat's father, Keeper James Dudley, kept the station from 1934 to 1950, through the war years and black out on Point Loma. This is a very special occasion. You might consider bringing sack lunches and beverages and picnic at the park. Karen will be your guide and host for your visit.
